

Specialisation Committee Vetsuisse Faculty Bern:

Residency Programme in Bovine Health Management (ECBHM)

Brief content description:

Practical training in individual animal medicine, herd management, herd diagnostics and clinical epidemiology of bovine animals. The focus includes herd health management with regular herd care and all herd-relevant aspects such as herd fertility, udder health, limb health, metabolic diseases, and feeding. Additionally, the training includes aspects of individual animal medicine such as internal medicine, surgery, and obstetrics.

The scientific activity includes the following in the scientific time provided for this purpose (at least 30% of working time): a scientific study as first author (as a dissertation), assistance (co-author) in another study. Alternatively, a study can be written as first author and a case report as first author. Participation in international conferences and presenting one's own scientific projects is also an integral part of the training.

Duration and Location:

The training lasts for 4 years, commencing by arrangement. The primary workplace is the Ruminant Clinic, Herd Health Management section, with the first 15 months completed as an internship at the stationary clinic in Bern. During the training, it is possible to work for 2 periods of 1 month at another European faculty (as an exchange with a local resident).

Board Examination: Attainment of the Specialist Title of the European College of Bovine Health Management.
